- Create daily lesson plans that are engaging, educational and exciting
- Deliver lesson plans in a way that catches the attention of the students and keeps them excited about learning
- Differentiate instruction for a variety of ability levels
- Create authentic assessments
- Implement positive behavior interventions

- Be willing and able to co-teach, co-assess, co-plan, and reflect with other staff members
- Reach school and grade level performance goals
- Watch closely for students who are struggling with their learning and help them find the resources and support they need
- Partner with families to support student learning and create positive school culture
- Support a trauma-informed approach to teaching and learning
- Offer experiential opportunities consistent with EL Education including service learning, authentic assessment, and character education
- Engage in professional learning with EL Education embedded into the school model and calendar
- Utilize the outdoor environment as a backdrop to learning
